#### New criminal laws biggest reform in independent India; justice process made simpler, transparent: Amit Shah

New Delhi: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday termed the enact-ment of three new criminal laws as the biggest reform in independent India and said they will make the judicial they will make the judicial process process not only affordable and accessible but also simpler, time-bound and transparent. Shah stressed that the Narendra Modi government framed the new laws -- Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), the Bharatiya Naganit Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) and the sannita (BNSS) and the Bharatiya Sakshya Ad-hiniyam (BSA) -- to ensure that all rights of citizens are protected and no criminal goes unpunished. the BSA, Shah said since all processes are online, nothing will be justice overlooked and ice will be delivered or time."These laws are going to transform the crimina to transform the criminal justice system in the country significantly. I assure all the citizens of India that it will take a maximum of three years for the full implementation of the new laws. I can also confidently say that anyone can get justice up to the Supreme

Court within three years of filing an FIR," he said. The BNS, BNSS and the BSA replaced the colonialera Indian Penal Code, the Code of Criminal Procedure and the Indian Evidence Act of 1872, respectively. The of 1872, respectively. The new laws came into effect on July 1, 2024. The home minister said the three laws are the biggest reform of in-dependent India and as-serted that the use of tech-nology will ensure that no criminal can escape punish-ment after committing a crime He said instites will crime.He said justice will definitely be delivered within a stipulated time.

In June, gross revenues from domestic transactions nom domestic transactions rose 4.6 per cent to about Rs 1.38 lakh crore, while GST revenue from imports grew 11.4 per cent to Rs 45,690 crore.The gross Central GST revenues stood at Rs 34,558 crore, State GST revenues at Rs 43,268 crore and Integrated GST at about Rs 93,280 lakh crore in

## Legal Metrology Deptt imposes Rs 2 lakh penalty for short delivery

JAMMU, JULY 1: Acting swiftly on the di-rection of Controller Legal Metrology Ra-jinder Singh Tara, Legal Metrology En-forcement, Jammu, has imposed a penalty of Rs. 2 lakh on a firm for supplying and marketing retail packages of wheat flour (Atta) with average lesser net quantity of 160g in each 10 kg bag. The department has taken this action fol-lowing a complaint alleging that a particular pre-packaged commodity sold in the mar-ket was lesser than the declared net quality. On the basis of the complaint, the matter was swiftly investigated by the department

On the basts of the complaint, the matter was swiftly investigated by the department and upon quantity measurement testing, it was established that net content of pre-packaged bags sold in the market was 160g lesser in net quantity on an average basis against the declared net quantity of 10kg. This was a serious infringement of consumer right and volatile of some of provisions of the Legal Metrology Act, 2009 and the Legal Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules, 2011. By supplying lesser than declared net quantity, the firm not only breached the customer trust but also violated the legal novisions of laws.

In view of this, the Legal Metrology En-forcement Unit, Jammu, under the overall

supervision of the Controller, has registered this case against the concerned firm and issued a notice to the defaulter. On receiving the notice of the department, the concerned defaulting supplier firm admitted violations and applied for department of the concerned defaulting supplier firm admitted violations and applied for department of concerned department of the concerned department of mitted violations and applied for depart-mental compounding which a legal remedy under the Act for first such offence within three years. The case against the firm was compounded and a penal sum of Rs. 2,00,000/- was realised on assurance from the firm for immediate compliance of net content correction of stocks as mandated content correction of stocks as mandated under the Legal Metrology AC, 2009and Legal Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules, 2011. He said that under the new laws, forensic evidence has been made mandatory for all cases where there is a provision of punishment of seven years.

Shah said in the criminal justice system, all three components — police, prosecution and judiciary — are bound by time limits in the new laws to ensure justice for citizens." The IPC, the CPF cand the Evidence Act were enacted for the protection of British rule. The new laws have been made for the protection of the citizen's body, property and constitutional rights," he said.

Since July 1, 2024, all fresh FIRs are registered under the BNS. However, cases filed earlier continued to be tried under the old laws till their final disposal. This scheme, with a corpus of Rs. 1 lakh crore will have a major impact on emerging and sunrise sectors. It will also boost private sector participation in the world of Rs.D." Modi said in a post on X.The scheme aims to provide long-term financing or refinancing with long tenors at low or ill interest rates to spur pivate sector investment in research, development and innovation, I&B Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw told reporters. He said the scheme has been designed to overcome the constraints and challenges in funding of the private sector and seeks to provide growth and risk capital to sunrise and

seeks to provide growth and risk capital to sunrise and ectors to facilitate innovation, promote adoption of ology and enhance competitiveness. The initiative wil also fina readiness levels, support acquisition of technologies which are critical or of high strategic importance, and facilitate set-ting up of a deep-tech fund of funds.

Vaishnaw said the governing board of Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF), chaired by the prime minis-Research Foundation (ANRF), chaired by the prime minis-ter, will provide overarching strategic direction to the RDI scheme. The Executive Council of ANRF will approve the scheme's guidelines, and recommend second level fund managers and scope and type of projects in surrise sectors. An Empowered Group of Secretaries led by the Cabinet Secretary, will be responsible for approving scheme changes, sectors and types of projects as well as second-level fund managers besides reviewing the performance of the Scheme. The Department of Science and Technology (DST) will serve as the nodal department for implementation of the RDI scheme. The scheme will have a two-tiered fund-

ing mechanism. At the first level, there will be a special purpose fund (SFP) established within the ANRF, which will act as the custodian of funds. "From the SPF funds shall be allocated to a variety of second level fund managers. This will be mainly in the form of long-term concessional loans," Vaishnaw said. The funding to R&D projects by the second level fund managers would normally be in the form of long-term loan at low or nil interestrates. Financing in the form of equity may also be done, especially in case of startups. Contribution to deep-tech fund of funds (FoF) or any other FoF meant for RDI may also be considered, he said.

# From ancient kilns to smart city: The metamorphosis of Moradabad

Moradabad, formerly known as Chaupala and also called Rustam Nagar, is one of the largest industrial cities in Uttar Pradesh Nestled on the gentle banks of the Ramganga River, it has long drawn water for its kilns and workshops - its artisans skillfully transforming molten brass into heirloom pieces. Today, Moradabad's handicraft industry and artistic brass-ware jewelry are celebrated across continents, earning it the affectionate nickname "Pital Nagri," or Brass City.

Moradabad sits 165 km east of New Delhi on NH 24 (now NH 9), a crucial highway bustling with trucks, buses, and aspirations heading towards Lucknow and beyond. For local entrepreneurs, NH 24 is more than just pavement; it represents a promise of timely deliveries and access to new market frontiers. Thanks to the Hapur-Moradabad six-laning project, which opened in March 2022, the travel time to the capital has already been reduced by almost 30 per cent. Proposed upgrades regional airport, a 60 m-wide ring road, and a 36 m industrial corridor — are poised to further weave Moradabad into India's economic tapestry.Under the Moradabad Master Plan 2031, city planners plot an ambitious traiectory for growth and inclusion.
