CRPF To Raise Special CoBRA Battalion For Counter-Terrorist Operations In J&K: DG

Neemuch (MP), Apr 17: The Central Reserve Police Force has decided to raise a special CoBRA battalion for counter-terrorist operations in Jammu and Kashmir, 17 years after this jungle warfare unit was raised in the paramilitary to undertake operations in Naxal-affected states.

CRPF Director General (DG) Gyanendra Pratap Singh announced this during the 86th Raising Day event of the force held in historic Madhya Pradesh town which is the 'birthplace' of about 3.25 lakh strong world's largest paramilitary force.

The DG said the force was in the process of raising a new Commando Battalion for Resolute Action (Co-BRA) for Jammu and Kash-



mir, as directed by Union Home Minister Amit Shah. Shah officiated as the chief guest of the event.

According to the CRPF chief, the futuristic unit will be used to enhance operational activities of the force in the Union Territory.

A senior officer said that the CoBRA unit will be tasked to undertake operations in the forested areas of Jammu and Kashmir including in the Jammu region where a

number of terrorist incidents have taken place in the recent past.

In 2023, some CoBRA

companies were sent to the Kashmir valley for training purposes but they were not deployed for any action. At present, regular CRPF units and its special commando unit called 'Kashmir valley quick action team (QAT)' undertake counter-

"I am confident that he will definitely attend the book launch tomorrow. If he doesn't come, it will be his own decision, but I had spoken to him about 10-15 days ago, and he had said that he would come," Mr. Dulat said. The former RAW Chief recalled that when Article 370 was abrogated, "Dr Sahab" (Farooq Abdullah) was heartbroken over what had happened to them. "It's well known that Farooq Sahab has said multiple times

that he has stood with Delhi and always has — but it is Delhi that hasn't been able to understand Dr. Sahab. The fault doesn't lie with Faroog, it lies with Delhi for failing to understand him," Mr. Dulat said.

Further, when whether the National Conference Chief's claims backing the abrogation of Article 370 are true, Mr. Dulat said that Mr. Abdullah never supported them.

"Two days before the abrogation was announced, Dr. Sahab, Omar Abdullah, and one of their MPs had met with the Prime Minister. I don't know what was discussed there. I even asked them, but I wasn't told anything. Afterwards, Faroog Sahab had told me that if the government wanted to do this, they should've taken us into confidence. But instead, we were put under house arrest. He has never supported the abrogation of Article 370," he said.

"Nowhere in the book have I written that Farooq supported Article 370. That is nonsense and just a media stunt. No one supported the abrogation, but the manner in which it was done could have been different through dialogue," Mr. Dulat added. The former RAW Chief asserted that his book is an appreciation of Farooq Abdullah, not a critique.

"If someone is saying that I've pulled a cheap stunt to sell my book, that's fine. I have no objection," he said. Praising the former J&K Chief Minister, Mr. Dulat (Contd on Pg 2)

burst Flood (GLOF) Monitoring Committee (FGMC) constituted by the Govt of J&K has conducted Expeditions to various such lakes to enhance understanding and preparedness against the potential hazards. Subsequently, geographical field expeditions were conducted to the two glacier lakes i.e. Sheshnag and Sonsar enroute Holy Amarnath Cave. The detailed report was shared with FGMC after the field expedition highlighting the major findings and future possibilities for deliberations. As part of the initiative, a specialized expedition team carried out the expeditions and undertook a comprehensive study of three critical glacial lakes in the Kishtwar district including Mundiksar Lake, Hangu Lake and Unnamed Lake in the Kishtwar region. The expedition provided valuable data on the lake

conditions, surrounding environmental factors, and potential risks of Glacial Lake Outburst Floods (GLOF) events. Next Expedition was carried out to Gangabal Lake, a high-altitude glacial lake located in the northwestern Himalayas. The expedition examined the physical and geological characteristics of Gangabal Lake. Particular focus was given to assessing the local geomorphology, the

Based on such screening, as on date, over 750 patients have already been shortlisted for undergoing different superspeciality and general surgeries in the domains of ENT, Gynaecology, Ophthalmology, Orthopaedic Surgery, Plastic Surgery, Urology using advanced laparoscopic technologies.

Pakistan that the Union Territories of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh "was, is and shall forever" remain an integral part of the country.

The ties between the two countries nosedived after India abrogated Article 370 of the Constitution, revoking the special status of Jammu and Kashmir, and bifurcating the State into two Union Territories on August 5, 2019.

In the same address, the powerful general urged the diaspora to preserve the values and vision for which Pakistan was created and share its story with their children.

"You have to tell Pakistan's story to your children so that they don't forget that our forefathers thought we were different from Hindus in every possible aspect of life," he said, evoking the two-nation theory propagated by Pakistan's founder M A Jinnah.

"Our religions are different, our customs are different, our traditions are different, our thoughts are different, our ambitions are different. That was the foundation of the two-nation theory that was laid there. We are two nations, we are not one nation," he added.

The general tried to present the case of a country that had a great past and a promising future.

"No matter where you live, remember – your roots lie in a high civilisation, noble ideology, and proud identity," he said. "We have never bowed down before adversity, and we never will."

CoBRA was raised in 2008-09, a time when Left Wing Extremism (LWE) was at its peak in multiple Indian states and insurgency in certain states of the Northeast was continuing. By 2011, 10 CoBRA battalions were raised and the numbers continue till now.

The J-K unit will be the 11th CoBRA battalion.

The commandos inducted in this unit are trained to undertake specific intelligence-based jungle warfare and guerilla tactics

The commando unit is provided with modern assault weapons, communication and surveillance gadgets and its profile is kept agile with the induction of young troops and high risk of GLOFs based on the assessments provided by the commanders, a continuous challenge for the CRPF as it does not get as many lower-age officers.

farmers and growers. The storm also caused extensive damage to the electricity infrastructure, with over a hundred poles and a dozen transformers destroyed in Jammu district alone.

The back wall of the secretariat in Jammu collapsed under which several vehicles suffered damages, and hailstorms in Udhampur further compounded the destruction. "The government must immediately deploy teams to assess the losses suffered by our people, especially farmers and fruit growers, who are the backbone of our economy," said Suri. "Prompt compensation must be provided to help them recover from this unforeseen calamity.'

Raman Suri also highlighted the Meteorological Department's forecast of continued rainfall and potential snowfall in higher areas until April 21, 2025, with a yellow warning issued for farmers to suspend agricultural activities. Dust storms are expected to resume from the evening of April 18, posing further risks. "Given the prediction of more adverse weather, the government must act proactively to safeguard lives and property," Suri urged.

RESTORATING J&K STATEHOOD.

It is said that the restoration of Statehood to Jammu & Kashmir Union Territory will be a beginning of a healing process, reclaiming the constitutional rights and protecting the identity of people of Jammu & Kashmir. It has been reported that the Cabinet has authorised the Chief Minister-Sh. Omar Abdullah to take up the matter with the Prime Minister and Government of India for restoration of Statehood.Just remembering the past, The Maharaja Gulab Singh, by his courage, wisdom and farsightedness, laid the foundations of Jammu & Kashmir State. Under the compelling security situation, Christian rulers of British India, had accepted and recognized, Raja Gulab Singh of Jammu as the Maharaja of Jammu & Kashmir. State. For all practical purposes, the Jammu & Kashmir State was a buffer State between the British India Empire and Afghanistan-Russia and also as a counter balance against the remaining Sikh kingdom of Lahore. A ray of hope became visible and the people joined the mainstream civilisation of their origin. The Regions of Ladakh, Jammu & Kashmir converged/ emerged as 'Independent' Jammu & Kashmir State, in British India. There is no parallel to this event in the world history to bring so divergent societies to converge under one umbrella and to save and secure it from Sun & Shower to let it blossom like a Lotus. In the words of K. M. Panikar," An area of more than Eighty thousand Square Miles, including parts of the Tibet as well as Pamier, besides the genuinely kingdoms of Jammu & Kashmir came into Maharaja Gulab Singh's possession. This area have never been effectively united under one rule and much of it, with of course, the exception of the Valley of Kashmir, had never known any settled Government." P. N. Bomzai writes," Maharaja Gulab Singh is the only Indian ruler, to have carved out a State, during the 19th Century, out of the wreckage of great Kingdoms of Sikhs. Moreover, he is the only Indian ruler to have extended the frontiers of India to their National boundary."India got its freedom from the British Christian rulers, on 15th August' 1947. The descendent of Maharaja Gulab Singh, Maharaja Hari Singh- the then ruler of Jammu & Kashmir State, acceded to India on 26th October' 1947. Later, the State Constituent Assembly adopted the Constitution of Jammu & Kashmir, declaring the State to be an integral part of the Union of India. (Contd.)

Deep tech needs deep investments

THE debate triggered by Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal's remarks about the focus of Indian startups has revolved around innovation and job creation. He wants startups to work in deep tech areas like artificial intelligence (AI), robotics, electric mobility and global logistics. This is a reasonable expectation, given the government's thrust on the promotion of startups and the opportunities that the vast consumer market of India presents. However, it would be difficult for startups to meet the expectation unless we address the underlying reasons for the situation described by the minister.

Most Indian startups are good at the application and adaptation of new technologies. Very few are engaged in novel technology development or commercialisation or scaling up of technologies and processes developed by Indian enti-

Technology development needs an ecosystem of fundamental research, link-ups with universities and a supply of requisite manpower. India did well in technology services because it had an ample supply of engineering manpower and this line of business did not need fundamental research. The country has performed reasonably well in life sciences with a good research system, partnership with acad-



emia and trained manpower. Indians working in outsourced R&D centres of foreign companies are developing new products and intellectual property for their parent companies. They can do so because they are backed by investment and are provided necessary tools.

Deep tech areas are driven by cutting-edge discoveries and high-level innovation, which in turn, can come only through deep and sustained investments in basic research and upgrading of universities. It is unrealistic to expect startups to come up with breakthrough innovations while the country spends less than 1 per cent of its GDP on research and development.

Quantum computing, for instance, has been one of the deep tech areas in the spotlight in India for the past couple of years. The government announced the National Quantum Mission (of which quantum computing is a focus area) with a funding of Rs 6,000 crore (about \$735 million) up to 2031. It may sound like a

big amount, but it pales in comparison with others — China has committed \$15 billion of public investment for its quantum technology initiatives.

Publication of research papers is another important attribute of fundamental research in any field. The National Natural Science Foundation of China is significantly ahead of its US counterpart in quantum computing research publications. When it comes to patents, IBM, Microsoft and Google as well as specialised quantum companies like D-Wave and Quantinuum hold a large number of quantum computing-related patents. These are the sources of the quantum software stacks other companies depend on. This could result in 'international dependency' in future due to possible export controls and restrictions, points out a new report on quantum science and technology prepared by the office of the Principal Scientific Advisor (PSA).

Deep tech is already being deployed to address prob-

energy to medicine. One example is the combination of AI and high-performance computing (HPC) to hunt for new battery materials. By deploying an AI model developed by Microsoft, scientists at the Pacific Northwest National Laboratory of the US Department of Energy could screen an amazing 32 million potential candidate materials and find a novel material that could slash lithium electrolyte requirement by almost 70 per cent. The breakthrough work was led by material scientist Vijay Murugesan, who did his PhD from Bharathiar University in Tamil Nadu. This is a classic case of how deep tech innovation can address a pressing problem through industry research institute partnerships. India has had an HPC mission for several years and strong material sciences groups, but we have yet to see such collaboration and outcome.

If the minister had cared to look at the draft of the National Deep Tech Startup Policy, prepared by the office of the PSA in 2023, he would have got answers to the questions he posed at the recent startup event. The policy, which still remains on paper, proposed "an increase in gross expenditure on R&D to provide renewed impetus to basic R&D, which would expand the emerging science base for deep tech startups and the critical base of trained

lems in fields ranging from scientific human resource." It also suggested amendments to existing research assessment systems in academic institutes and research labs to enable the translation of knowledge generated into entrepreneurial ventures. This could be done by creating technology commercialisation offices in research labs and providing necessary guidelines. In addition, faculty members need to be given incentives to let them undertake entrepreneurial risks. This way, they can either launch their own startups or transfer the technology to existing ones. Besides enhanced R&D expenditure and industryacademia collaboration, the deep tech development depends on access to critical materials like lithium and rare earth minerals the global supplies of which are controlled by China. Then there are strategic materials like advanced composites, carbon and ceramic materials that go into the sectors of defence, nuclear, space, aerospace and electronics. Access to such materials is also restricted.

Govt advises coaching centres to adhere to guidelines for preventing misleading ads

New Delhi, Apr 16:

The Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has advised coaching centres to strictly adhere to the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 and Guidelines for the Prevention of Misleading Advertisements in the Coaching Sec-

The CCPA has clearly outlined that it is essential for the coaching centres to ensure that their representations are accurate, clear, and free from misleading claims or the concealment of important information from consumers.

Additionally, coaching centres should avoid making assurances of guaranteed success. Coaching centres must clearly disclose key details in their advertisements, including the student's name, rank, course type, and whether the course was paid. Disclaimers must be prominently displayed in the same font size as other important information to ensure consumers are not misled.

Following the recent declaration of results for examinations such as IIT-JEE and NEET, the CCPA observed that coaching



centres are not adhering to the Guidelines for the Prevention of Misleading Advertisements in the Coaching Sector, 2024

Considering the violation of the Act and the Guidelines, the CCPA recently has issued Notices to few coaching institutes pertaining to following issues: - Guaranteed placement/selection Assurance of rank in JEE/NEET, Violation of consumer rights, Misleading advertisement and Unfair trade practices including promised services not provided, admission cancelled but fee not refunded, deficiency in service, non/partial refund of fees.

These claims and practices, according to the CCPA, appear to be violating various provisions of the Act, including Sections 2(28) and 2 (47) of the Consumer Protection Act and Guidelines for Prevention of Misleading Advertisement in the Coaching Sector.

The Guidelines for the Prevention of Misleading Advertisements in the Coaching Sector, 2024, were issued on 13 Novem-

ber 2024. These guidelines prohibit coaching centres from making false or misleading claims/advertisements to promote their services and from engaging in deceptive or unfair practices. These guidelines represent a vital step toward preventing the exploitation of students and ensuring that they are not misled by false promises or compelled into unfair contracts. The guidelines are framed to enhance transparency and fairness in the sector, helping students and their families make informed decisions based on accurate and truthful information. These guidelines supplement existing regulations and further strengthen the regulatory framework governing advertisements in the coaching sector.

In a significant move to protect consumer rights and ensure transparency in the coaching sector, the CCPA has, over the past three years, taken action against misleading advertisements, unfair trade practices, and violations of consumer rights by coaching cen-

The new curriculum under NEP 2020 will follow a phased timeline, starting with Class 1 in 2025-26 academic year and expanding to all grades by 2028-29. According to the notification,

In its interim order, SEBI explained how loans taken for buying new EVs for BluSmart were diverted by the duo for personal use, including the purchase of a luxury apartment in Gurgaon.

It detailed various instances of fund diversion, including how Gensol raised money to procure electric vehicles (EVs). The order lists that Jaggi transferred Rs 6 crore to his mother, Rs 2 crore to



his wife, and Rs 50 lakh to Grover's Third Unicorn.

Notably, Gensol took term loans worth Rs 978 crore from IREDA and PFC between 2021 and 2024, with Rs 664 crore allocated for the purchase of 6.400 EVs set to be leased to BluSmart.

Gensol was set to provide an additional equity (margin) contribution of 20%, bringing the total expected deployment for the purchase of EVs to approximately Rs 830 crore. SEBI said there is a

complete breakdown of internal controls and corporate governance norms at Gensol, despite its status as a listed company. 'The promoters were running a listed public company as if it were a proprietary firm," the order

US Congressional delegation visits Taiwan, reaffirms strengthening free and open Indo-Pacific

United Nations, Apr 14:

A US Congressional delegation led by Republican Party Senator Pete Ricketts began its April 16-19 Taiwan visit – first since US President Donald Trump began his second term at the White House – on Wednesday as part of a larger visit to the region underscoring Washington's commitment to strengthening a free and open Indo-Pacific.

Other members of the bi-partisan delegation include Senator Chris Coons from the Democratic Party and Senator Ted Budd from the Republican Party.

The delegation will engage in a series of high-level meetings with senior Taiwan leaders to discuss US-Taiwan relations, regional security, trade and investment, and other significant issues of mutual interest

Earlier this month, the US had condemned China's joint military exercises near Taiwan, slamming Beijing's growing assertiveness in the Indo-Pacific region.



'Once again, China's aggressive military activities and rhetoric toward Taiwan only serve to exacerbate tensions and put the region's security and the world's prosperity at risk. In the face of China's intimidation tactics and destabilising behaviour, the United States' enduring commitment to our allies and partners, including Taiwan, continues," read a statement issued by the US State Department spokesperson Tammy

"The United States supports peace and stability across the Taiwan Strait and opposes unilateral changes to the status quo, including through force or coercion," it added.

The remarks followed after China confirmed that it had con-

ducted joint army, navy, and rocket exercises around Taiwan. Taiwan's Defence Ministry also condemned the act and stated that China continues to escalate military activities in the Taiwan Strait and the Indo-Pacific region by intensifying military threats and challenging the international order and regional stability, thereby becoming the greatest "troublemaker" in the eyes of the international community.

Last month, a bipartisan group of US lawmakers reintroduced the Taiwan International Solidarity Act in the House of Representatives after the pro-Taiwan legislation stalled in the Senate in 2023. The act "encourages the US to work with allies and partners to oppose China's efforts to undermine Taiwan's diplomatic relationships and partnerships globally," said a press release issued by the office of US Representative Gerry Connolly, a Democrat who introduced the bill.

US tariff hikes no longer make economic sense: China

Beijing, Apr 14: A Chinese foreign ministry spokesperson said on Thursday that the United States' 245 per cent tariff on certain products from China no longer makes economic sense.

A new report released on Wednesday by the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (ES-CWA) reveals a significant gap in labour force participation between males and females in the Arab region.

Dubbed 'Progress on the Sustainable Development Goals, A gender snapshot of the Arab region 2024', the report said that only one in five women in the region is employed or seeking employment, compared to the global average of 49 per cent.

Women in the region continue to shoulder a disproportionate share of unpaid domestic and care work, spending 4.7 times more hours per day on it than men.

Gaza 'annexation' part of military strategy, says Israeli defence minister

Jerusalem, Apr 14: Israel's Defence Minister, Israel Katz, has affirmed that Gaza's annexation was part of a military strategy and troops will remain in the security zones created in Lebanon and Syria indefinitely,

Al Jazeera reported. Defence Minister Israel Katz said the Israeli military will continue to block humanitarian aid from entering Gaza in order to pressure Hamas to surrender.

Meanwhile, the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) on Thursday stated that 3,696 Palestinian children were newly admitted for acute malnutrition, which marked a stark increase compared with the number in February, which was 2,027.

"Food consumption in Gaza has sharply deteriorated due to the blockade on the entry of humani-



tarian aid and other critical supplies now in its seventh week," OCHA said.

"Consumption of key food groups - such as meat, poultry, dairy, vegetables, and fruits - remains critically low," it added. The lack of access to water in Gaza is also fuelling "a severe survival crisis with far-reaching consequences for public health and protection. Water is essential for survival, yet access to safe water has become dangerously limited," the UN Humanitarian Affairs agency said.

The US special envoy for hostage affairs, Adam Boehler, told Al Jazeera that a ceasefire in Gaza will only be possible once all the captives held by Hamas in the Palestinian enclave are released. Boehler's statement comes as ceasefire negotiations continue amid the Israeli military's intense renewed assault on Gaza. The envoy emphasised release of the remaining captives by Hamas is an essential non-negotiable precondition for any lasting truce.

The United Nations said an estimated 5,00,000 people have been "newly displaced or uprooted once more" in Gaza since Israel broke the ceasefire with Hamas on March 18.

Israel's Defence Minister Israel Katz said his country's "policy is clear" and preventing all humanitarian aid from entering Gaza is a "tool" to pressure Hamas.

Joint enforcement drive conducted in Marh to curb traffic violations




